

Copeland receives leadership award

Kari Copeland, a graduate student at the University of Mississippi (UM) received the 2010 Winifred Burks-Houck Graduate Student Leadership Award. This award is given on behalf of the National Society for the Professional Advancement of Black Chemists and Chemical Engineers (NOBCChE) and the Center for Enabling New Technologies Through Catalysis (CENTC). This award recognizes leadership and commitment to research and outreach activities.



Funding from this award will provide travel and accommodations to attend the NOBCChE 37th Annual Conference in Atlanta, Georgia. It also offers enrollment (including travel and accommodations) to the 2010 CENTC Summer School, "Emerging Perspectives in Catalysis" to be held July 19-22 in Seattle, Washington.

Copeland's research is under the direction of Dr. Greg Tschumper, associate professor in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry at UM, and she is funded through the NSF EPSCoR project.
